Manuscripts should be submitted typed, double-spaced, and with endnotes. The journal only accepts manuscripts via e-mail or on IBM compatible computer disks, with Microsoft WORD or WordPerfect formats required. A clean paper copy of the manuscript is requested along with the disk. All articles are required to follow the style formats specified in the *Chicago Manual of Style*, 15<sup>th</sup> edition.

Illustrations should not be embedded in the article, but their locations should be indicated in the article text and captions provided. Submit photos as originals or as separate files scanned as TIFF at a minimum of 300dpi. Authors are responsible for obtaining copyright use permissions for all illustrations and for paying any associated fees.
